

Chesham Bois Heritage Trail

The Old Rectory

The Rectory was built in 1833 by the Duke of Bedford for his relation, the Hon Lowther Barrington, when he became Rector of St Leonards. Grade II listed, it is built in the style of a small Tudor Manor, similar to the Russell properties at Chenies and Woburn. The ducal coronet is displayed above the imposing porch. The adjoining stable block preserves the original brick floor, stalls and mangers and is also Grade II listed. The foundations of the Old Parsonage are to the south-east of the present building.
