How to get here:

Buckinghamshire and The Chilterns is easily accessible by road, rail and five major airports. The county is well served by motorways, with the M1, M25 and M40 all passing through or nearby, and provides links to the M4 & M3 motorways. All towns within the county are linked by good main roads.

The county also has great rail links from London via the underground on the Metropolitan line, while Chiltern Railways offers a number of access points from London Marylebone.

We advise you to call beforehand to enquire about the availability of on-site coach parking. All of our venues do have parking, except Amersham Museum, Thame Midsomer Tours, Roald Dahl Museum and Milton's Cottage.

1. Discover Stowe House and Gardens

The scale, grandeur and beauty of Stowe House and Gardens is not to be missed. Discover over 300 years of history at this beautiful 18th century estate. Learn about the rise and fall of one of England's wealthiest families and explore the amazing Capability Brown landscape gardens.

2. Literary Heroes

Milton's Cottage is one of the oldest writer's house museums in the world and the place where John Milton completed his epic masterpiece, Paradise Lost.

The Roald Dahl Museum in Great Missenden, the Buckinghamshire village where Roald Dahl lived and wrote for 36 years, is not to be missed. If time allows, why not walk the Roald Dahl village trail.

Woburn Abbey and Gardens and Bletchley Park

Start your tour at Woburn Abbey, the historic home of the Duke of Bedford which boasts one of the most significant art collections in the world and is where Second World War WRNS (Women's Royal Naval Service) were billeted for their vital war work at Bletchley Park. After lunch, re-join your tour for an afternoon visit to Bletchley Park, home of the codebreakers during the Second World War.

Stowe Gardens and Waddesdon Manor Gardens

The gardens at Stowe and Waddesdon are a gardener's delight. Stowe was never just a garden. Its creator, Lord Cobham, set the 250 acres of gardens, including temples and monuments, to reveal his beliefs about the politics and morality of the day. A buffet lunch is included before continuing your tour to Waddesdon Manor Gardens. Waddesdon had one of the most important Victorian gardens. Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild created his garden for the amusement of his guests, who spent an entire morning on their tour.
