Amersham Museum brings to life the fascinating story of Amersham and the surrounding villages through an exciting programme of exhibitions and events.

Based largely in a medieval hall house, Amersham Museum explores life in the town through family-friendly displays. Sit at the Tudor dinner table, relax in the 1930s living room, or listen to stories in Ron Haddock's 1960s record shop.



Travel through time with our brand-new timeline display. From fossils to doll's houses, Elizabeth I to Margaret Thatcher, and the Stone Age to the future, find out about Amersham's vibrant past.

Visit our changing exhibition programme in our new gallery. Join a guided walk, take part in an activity session, or wander through our herb garden. Pop into our shop full of local and locally-inspired gifts.

Our website is a constantly-updated treasure trove about Amersham and its residents from ancient history to the present day, perfect for anyone wanting to explore the area and its past.

WALKS

Our walks programme runs from April to October, pre-booking via our website advised. Tickets are £6 for adults, children free. You can find all dates and details on our website.

Choose from:

Weekly walks around Amersham Old Town,

on Sunday afternoons at 2:30pm. Starting at the Museum and lasting around an hour, explore Amersham's early history, or its 19th and 20th century development.

Monthly walks led by costumed Tudor guides, on the last Saturday of the month at 2:30pm. Find out about life – and death – in Amersham in Tudor times from food and drink, to fairs and markets, and visit the Lollard martyrs memorial. The walk starts at the Museum and usually lasts about 2 ¼ hours, but can be shortened by request.

Our Midsomer Murders and More walk which takes visitors to local film and TV locations including Four Weddings and a Funeral and The Midwich Cuckoos. This circular five-mile walk starts at Amersham Station.



CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Schools

Our award-winning Learning Programme offers bespoke taught sessions featuring workshops, visits, assemblies, handling objects, artefact loans and whole school experience days. Themes include Local History, Fossils, Amersham's Tudor Story, Victorians, The Coming of the Railway, Amersham in WWII, Traditional Toys, Houses and Homes. Our wider curriculum visits involve our sensory garden from Growth Mindset Workshops to tailored SEND access visits. We partner with Kids in Museums and can host a Museum Takeover Event.

Children's Art Club: after-school on term time Wednesdays

Our fantastic, accredited Art Club for children aged 7-11 is run by a freelance artist and covers a range of disciplines, and art experiences. Children work towards Arts Award Discover and Explore levels. It is a welcoming, relaxed, and creative space.
