Amersham Martyrs Community Play: Overview

Amersham Museum seeks a Producer and a Director for its next production of the Amersham Martyrs Community Play which is scheduled to take place in St Mary's Church from 8 March – 20 March 2027.

The Martyrs Play is a community-driven theatrical production that dramatizes the true story of the Amersham Martyrs—local men and women burned at the stake for their religious beliefs in the early 16th century. Commissioned and owned by Amersham Museum, the play was first performed in 2001 and has since been restaged several times, involving a large local cast and embracing a promenade style that places the audience amid the action.

Experience has shown that the play requires a substantial lead time which is why planning is starting now for the 2027 production.

Detailed lists of key responsibilities – including notes listing volunteer help that will be available - and person specification will be sent to anyone who expresses and interest in either position. A summary for Producer and Director roles is shown below.

The Recruitment Process

The Martyrs Play Steering Group will be available to answer questions and clarify issues – either via video link or in person meetings if you think it would be helpful prior to submitting an application.

The deadline for expressions of interest is **30 November 2025**. Interviews will be held in January 2026, and we will appoint a Producer soon afterwards. The Producer will take part in the process of selecting a Director.

Key Responsibilities

Planning & Coordination

- Oversee schedules, deadlines, and coordination meetings.
- Support Director recruitment and internal communication.
- Monitor progress and ensure requirements are met.

Budget & Fundraising

- Prepare and manage budgets with the committee.
- Lead on grants, sponsorships, and fundraising events.

Ticketing & Front of House

- Write press releases, coordinate media, and supervise promotional materials.

Director: Amersham Martyrs Community Play: Summary

Key Responsibilities:

- Develop and communicate a clear artistic vision, adapting the script and interpreting its historical themes for contemporary audiences.
- Collaborate with the Producer and production team to coordinate rehearsal schedules, casting, and logistics, ensuring the production runs efficiently.
- Direct all rehearsals, guiding actors of varied experience (including children and volunteer performers) in role preparation, staging, and improvisation.
- Lead auditions and provide constructive feedback to help cast members embody their roles and work as an ensemble.
- Oversee creative aspects such as blocking, pacing, and use of the church space, working closely with technical and design teams.
- Foster an inclusive, supportive environment for all cast and crew, upholding the values of community engagement and educational outreach.
- Coordinate with local schools, advisors, and community groups to maximize participation and audience impact.
